The Reference Point

The State Highway Department in Pennsylvania once set out to build a bridge, working from both sides. When the workers reached the middle of the waterway, they found they were thirteen feet to one side of each other. Alfred Steinberg, writing some time ago in the Saturday Evening Post, went on to explain that each crew of workmen had used its own reference point.

There is a small bronze disk on the Meads' ranch in north central Kansas where the thirty-ninth parallel from the Atlantic to the Pacific crosses the ninety-eighth meridian running from Canada to the Rio Grande.

The National Ocean Survey, a small federal agency whose business it is to locate the exact position of every point in the United States, uses the scientically recognized reference point on the Meads' ranch. So far, no mistakes have been made, and none are expected.

All ocean liners and commercial planes come under the survey. The government can build no dams or even shoot off a missile without this agency to tell it exact locations—to the very inch.

"Location by approximation," the article goes on to say, "can be costly and dangerous."

The Reference Point for the Christian is the Bible. All values, judgments, and attitudes must be gauged in relationship to this Reference Point.

Romans 2:15 --

Someone has said:

"Conscience is a personal vigilant eye before which every imagination, thought, and act is held up to censure or approval."

God has placed within each one of us something that cries aloud against us whenever we do anything that we know to be wrong.

Conscience is the detective which watches the trend of our steps and decries every conscious transgression.

ILL: An Indian's definition:

"It is a little threecornered thing inside of me.

When I do wrong, it turns around and hurts me very much; but if I keep on doing wrong, it will turn so much that the corners become worn off and it does not hurt me anymore."

engers, millions of miles each year with very few disasters, due to a remarkable device known as the "radio beam."

We, too, have a beam of divine light and guidance, which we call conscience.

ILL: Emmanuel Kart, in his "Oritique of Pure Reason," said: There were just two things that filled him with awe -- the starry heavens, and conscience in the breast of man.

Conscience -- the moral judiciary of the soul. Not sheriff, not law but judge.

Conscience -- does not lay down a law - but warns of the existence of a law

- -- It is an ideal Moses thundering from an invincible Sinia.
- It is like a magnetic needle -indicates the existence of an
 unseen power.

Conscience is the great proof of God.

- -- Conscience is our wisest counselor and teacher, our most faithful and most patient friend; and can be our worst enemy.
- There are <u>no punishments</u> or <u>re-wards</u> comparable to those of conscience.
- The Psalmist said: "Man's conscience is the lamp of the eternal."
 - is God's lamp within man's breast.

ILL: In <u>Paradise</u> <u>Lost</u>, at the creation of man. Milton puts into the mouth of the Creator these words:

"I will put my umpire -conscience -- in his breast."

ILL:

Men, hundreds of years ago, used to talk about a magic ring, which whenever an evil thought passed throught the mind of him who wore the ring, or whenever he was tempted to do an evil deed, the ring pressed painfully upon his finger.

-- Each one of us wears a ring more wonderful than the fabled magic ring.

The magic ring is conscience.

-- Aman may or may not obey, but conscience faithfully does its part.

It is a red light flashing in our souls. A Red Light on Airbone In some social parlor, in some quiet study, in a crowded street, in a business office, or in a country lane -- temptation speaks its seductive whisper, and there conscience has flashed its warning.

- II. THE BIBLE SPEAKS OF SEVERAL KINDS OF CONSCIENCE.
 - 1 An evil conscience.

Hebrews 10:22 --

"Let us draw near, with a true heart, in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure wature."

In another place the Bible talks about a defiled conscience

Titus 1:15 --

"Unto them that are defiled and unbelieving is nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled."

Is it possible for the very thing that tells us when we are knowingly wrong to become itself debauched?

Can a little bell that is supposed to ring and give us a clear note become cracked so that its note will be false?

This is true when you reject the voice of conscience.

Its voice will grow weaker and weaker until finally it will

approve the wrong and become evil itself.

It will begin calling evil "good" and it will call the good "evil"

It will put darkness for "light" and light for "darkness."

It will say that bitter is sweet and that sweet is bitter.

ILL: Gangsters and immoral men must have evil consciences.

ILL: Days of Noah when imaginations and thoughts of the hearts of the people were evil continually.

The Bible says: "God gave them up,"

No more conscience for sin.

Hebrews 10:2 --

- For then would they not have c ceased to be offered? because that the worshippers once purged should have had no more conscience of sins."
- (1) You may have no conscience for sin because you have slain your conscience. Mr. Soul with a Hot from
- (2) You may be given over to your own selfishness and sin that nothing you say, think, or do will seem to matter.
- (3) Your conscience has been driven away as a friend and a counselor and comes back in the form of remorse.

- ILL: Put a stopper on your <u>ear</u>, and after a while you cannot hear.
 - Continue to refuse God's call, and after a while you cannot hear.
- 3 A convicting conscience.

John 8:9 --

- "And they...being convicted by their own conscience, went out one by one."
- The Holy Spirit uses conscience to convict.

However, conscience cannot revoke its sentence or suspend its judg-ment.

It cannot heal the wound which it inflicts.

- It cannot wash out the stain of the soul.
- It cannot undo the past.
- gressions, for its business is not to cover up but to uncover.
- Hence it is that we all need the great mercy of God in Christ, whose blood cleanseth us from all sin.
- Christ alone can say to the conscience, "Be still."

Come, then, to the foot of the cross-the cross where Paul, who persecuted Christ, found peace.

Mhere <u>Peter</u>, who denied Him, found peace;

And where the thief who reviled Him found peace.

"Though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow."

III. YOU CAN HAVE A GOOD CONSCIENCE.

Paul said in Acts 23:1 --

"Brethren, I have lived in all good conscience before God until this day."

Conscience is not infallible in making a choice.

In fact, choosing is not the mission of conscience.

Conscience merely tells us whether the choice which we make is according to our honest conviction.

ILL: Cunard steamship thought it was within two hundred miles of Nantucket shores.

Suddenly the Lookout cried: "Land, Ho!"

They had miscalculated by 200 miles because a single nail driven before leaving Liverpool, by the carpenter in putting up a stove -- it had done its work steadily and surely upon the needle, and nearly hurled the ship into the rocks.

Conscience is the needle. Some secret sin is the nail.
