- I accept it with humility and unworthiness
- and I take it as a symbol of the common historical ties that have bound our two nations together over the years.

- ILL: I read a quote that appeared in The Daily

 News in 1903 about Queen Victoria.
- After hearing the Dean preach a sermon about Christ's return to earth,
 Queen Victoria said:
 - "Oh how I wish that the Lord might come during my lifetime!"
- When the Dean asked her why, she replied:
 - "I should so love to lay my crown at His feet."

- In the same way, I would like to give God the glory for whatever has been accomplished through my life
- and I, too, look forward to the day when I can lay at His feet every honor I have been privileged to receive.

- Naturally, there have been scores of people associated with Ruth and me who deserve this honor as much as I do
 - and I would like to share it with them

- especially two of them who are here tonight, and have been with me for fifty years:
 - Cliff Barrows and George Beverly Shea.

- Over the years, we have been in Great Britain
 many times
 - more than in any other nation except my own.

My ancestry is British, of course.

- Shortly after World War Two, Cliff Barrows and I, and our wives, went to Britain for six months of ministry.
- Ruth and I will never forget the courage and determination of the British people in those difficult years after the War.
- -- We had gone over there to encourage them
 - but instead, they encouraged us
 - and taught us more than I will ever be able to express.

- ILL: We often had difficulty with accents, especially when we were in Scotland, or Yorkshire
- George Beverly Shea was in London for our meetings in 1954, and he was singing:
 - "It took a miracle to put the stars in place"

- But one person misheard the words, and
 wrote that it seemed awfully arrogant for that
 American Gospel singer to say: "It took
 - AMERICA to put the stars in place!"

- Over the years, we have <u>returned</u> to <u>Great</u>
 Britain many times
 - and certainly one of the most memorable experiences of those visits has been the privilege of being with Her Majesty on occasion
 - and to preach at Windsor and
 Sandringham at her gracious
 invitation.

- I am honored to stand beside this Christmas tree that reminds us all of Jesus Christ and His love for us.
- He not only loves us in the Western world
 - but He loves all people, no matter what their ethnic or religious background.

Again, Your Excellency, thank you for this delightful and memorable occasion.

- Since September 11, we have seen signs all over our nation saying, "God Bless America."

- Your nation, however, also shared in the horror and loss of that tragic day
- and in a special way tonight may my family, my colleagues, and I ask for God's special blessing on Great Britain and its people, especially during these days.

and God bless Her Majesty The Queen.
